During 2018, Full Circle offered direct Educational Trainings to four organizations, serving 169 adults. This program provided organizations with bereavement training led by an experienced mental health professional.

INDIVIDUAL BEREAVEMENT CONSULTATIONS

Our clinical team provided professional support and consultative services to 376 adults through email, phone, and one-on-one meetings. Many of these consultations included:

- Guidance in dealing with grief and loss
- Communicating with children about death
- Preparing for the memorial services
- Recommendations for books and other community resources

SCHOOL GROUP **PROGRAM**

This group helped me talk about my feelings and be brave.

During 2018, Full Circle provided eight-week counseling groups to 21 students from Oak Grove and Westover Hills Elementary Schools, who were grieving the death of a loved one.

100% of youth aged 6-10 reported that attending HOH helped them to stay connected to and remember their loved one.

91% of adults reported that they were managing their feelings with healthy coping skills, while only 77% reported doing so at the start of the group.

OVERDOSE LOSS PROGRAM

During 2018, Full Circle responded to our community's opiod crisis and added three Overdose Loss Groups to our menu of services.

97% of members reported managing their feelings with healthy coping skills, up from 69% at the start of the group This is a significant increase and critical to members' long-term well-being.

97% of members reported knowing ways to stay connected with their loved one, up from 73% at the start of the

74% of members reported no longer feeling alone in their grief, up from 47% at the start of the group. This decrease in feeling isolated is significant as this is often the primary presenting problem/need reported by members prior to starting an Overdose Loss Group.
